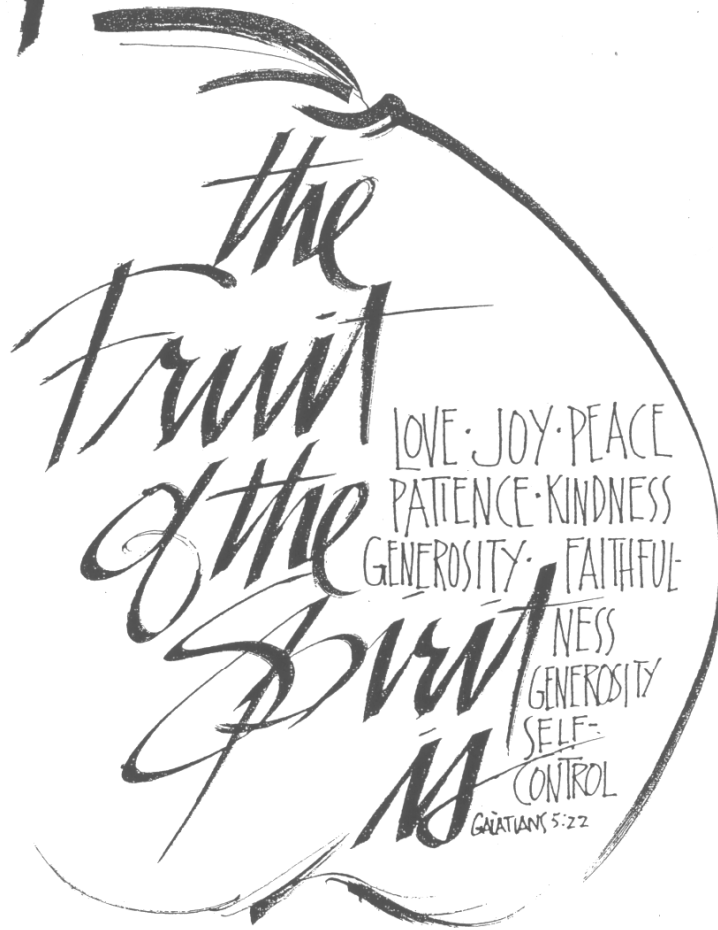

Sacrament of Reconciliation

Reconciliation is available Saturday, 3:30 to 4:15 p.m., or after the 4:30 p.m. Mass in the Reconciliation Room of the Chapel. Fr. Joel is available during the week by appointment. Communal Penance services are held occasionally throughout the year.

*"In those days it will come to pass, God says:
I will pour out my spirit upon all flesh.
Your sons and daughters shall prophesy,
your old men shall dream dreams,

And we say it loudly and clearly today with all the saints, "Jesus is Lord!", as one body which has many parts, and many diverse gifts, because we are all given to drink of the one Spirit. "To each individual the manifestation of the Spirit is given for some benefit;" the common good!

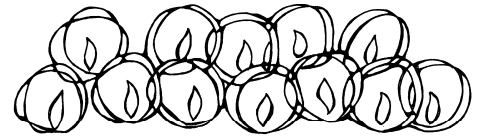

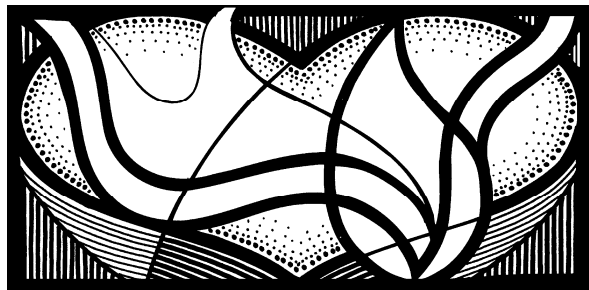

C.A.R.E. CORNER

Today marks the 50th day of Easter, which officially closes the Easter season. Our Church commemorates this day with the feast of Pentecost. At Pentecost, we celebrate the receipt of the Holy Spirit by Jesus' disciples, but also by thousands of others from around the world. And this Holy Spirit of God transformed them as they overcame all language barriers to hear and understand the witness of the disciples to "the mighty acts of God."

Such witness was indeed a sign of God's presence, because only moments earlier the disciples were cowering behind locked doors before experiencing a transformation of their own. The passage in Acts (2:1-4) tells us that God manifested His presence through such signs as the coming of "a strong, driving wind," the appearance of "tongues . . . of fire," and the fact that each "began to speak in different tongues . . ." But this was by no means the first time God had revealed His presence to our ancestors. Join us here over the next several weeks as we continue to explore the "signs" of God with us.

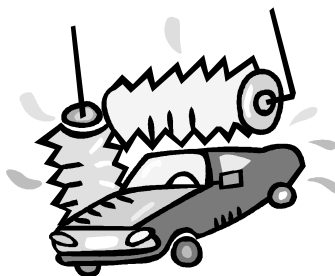
We're Having a Garage Sale AND Pancakes!

Update from Duchity

A small team visited our Twinning parish and the Duchity, Haiti community in May. The purpose of the trip was to visit Ertha's orphanage and to dialogue with Father Marcel and other leaders in the community. Ertha's orphanage is now officially recognized by the Haitian government and she is able to have her children adopted. She currently has 29 children, including 8 babies and toddlers. They are healthy and are doing well. Below are excerpts from the talk that I was asked to give at the Sunday liturgy. The Moeser family sang an upbeat "Is It I, Lord" to the delight of the congregation.

Bon jou ... I am happy to be back home again in Duchity. I always feel welcome in Duchity and at Ste. Marie-Madeleine. I know that God is here with us. This time I have come with some friends that are in Haiti for the first time. They are a family — Margaret and David, their children, Mairead and Devon, and Margaret's mother, Theresa. We bring greetings from Naperville and St. Thomas the Apostle parish. You are always in our prayers.

Margaret and David have worked hard with Ertha on her orphanage. They came to see what has been done and to meet the children. We have come to have many meetings to continue our collaboration with our friends in Duchity. I met with Francie and Jean Toni and they told me about the Organization of Youth for the Progress and Development of Haiti. I met with Nacize and she told me about the Group of Women Active in Duchity. It is very exciting for us to see the young adults of Duchity working together to make this an even better place to live. It is a very positive action.

My favorite meeting was with the graduating class of St. Thomas High School. Education is very important in Naperville, and I know education is also very important in Duchity. For the last three years, we have helped you add one classroom and one grade each year. And this year, for the very first time, there will be a high school graduation in Duchity. In Duchity, I know you are very proud. In Naperville, we are also very proud. We congratulate the St. Thomas Class of 2009.

And we had a meeting with Father Marcel to talk about the construction of the medical clinic. He told us how your community has helped collect rock for the foundation and the walls. That is a wonderful surprise. It is good that we are working together to build the medical clinic, which is very important for the village. At St. Thomas, we have been trying to save money for three years. Today, I am pleased to announce that as soon as you have collected enough rocks, we can begin construction. I hope that will be soon.

We want to thank Father Marcel for welcoming us and for taking very good care of us. We are praying for him and for the people of Ste. Marie-Madeleine. We ask you to pray for us. The Holy Spirit is with all of us ... Mesi anpiel.

Life Line Screening at St. Thomas

St. Thomas will host a preventive health screening Tuesday, June 23. Life Line Screening will offer ultrasound screenings for the prevention of stroke and vascular disease. Results are reviewed by a board certified vascular surgeon and sent directly to you to take to your physician for any needed follow up.

These screenings are non-invasive, painless and affordable; the Stroke, Vascular Disease and Heart Rhythm Package (4 tests) is only \$139. Also, a finger stick blood package including cholesterol, triglycerides, HDL/LDL, and glucose is available for an additional \$50 with that package. Osteoporosis-\$10 additional with ultrasound package.

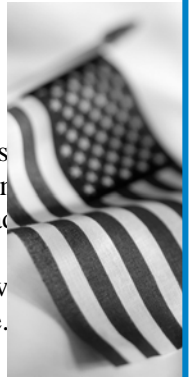
