## C.A.R.E CORNER

Jesus knew the importance of staying closely connected to his heavenly Father in order to know God's will. This is what gave Jesus the strength to fulfill the mission he was given. He loved God with his entire being. He heard the word of God and observed it (see Luke 11:28). He shared the word of God everywhere he went, preaching it to anyone who would listen. He dedicated his earthly life for the sake of the gospel (see Mark 8:35). He modeled a servant mentality, which we can clearly see in John 13:4+ when he washed the feet of his disciples. He took up his cross – literally – and gave his own life as spiritual food for others.



Jesus wanted his followers to do the same. So he encouraged his disciples to stay close to him, to abide in him, to stay connected like branches to their life-giving Source – “the true vine” (John 15:1). He commissioned his disciples to teach others “to observe all that I have commanded you.” (Matthew 28:20) Jesus fed his flock while he was with them and he instructed Peter as his successor to do the same for any new disciples (John 21:15+). If we want to be model Christian disciples, we must do all of these as well.

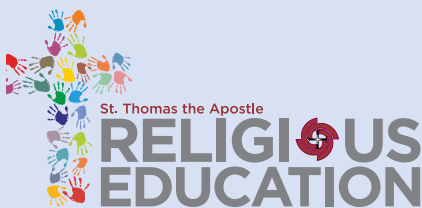

## Pope Leo XIV Offers Apology for Church's Role in Slavery



In his first encyclical, Magnifica Humanitas (Magnificent Humanity), Pope Leo XIV issued a historic apology for the Catholic Church's role in legitimizing slavery and for failing to condemn it sooner. Calling slavery "a wound in Christian memory," the pope acknowledged that past Church leaders and institutions at times supported or tolerated systems of human bondage.

Previous popes had apologized for the actions of individual Christians involved in the slave trade, but Pope Leo went further by recognizing the role some Vatican documents played in giving European powers

authority to enslave non-Christians during the colonial era.

The pope writes, "It is impossible not to feel deep sorrow when contemplating the immense suffering and humiliation endured by so many in stark contrast to their immeasurable dignity as persons infinitely loved by the Lord. For this, in the name of the Church, I sincerely ask for pardon."

This is an important step toward truth, reconciliation and a deeper commitment to justice rooted in the Gospel.

## World Refugee Day, June 20

On June 20, the global community observes World Refugee Day, a time to honor the courage, resilience and dignity of people who have been forced to flee their homes because of war, violence, persecution or disaster. This day reminds us that behind every statistic is a human story – families seeking safety, children longing for stability and neighbors searching for hope.

This year's theme for World Refugee Day is Until Everyone is Safe. In a world marked by conflict and displacement, refugees are not strangers to be feared but neighbors to be welcomed with compassion and care.

Today, more than 117 million people worldwide remain displaced by violence and persecution. Yet even amid hardship, refugees enrich communities through their faith, talents, perseverance and hope.

As Christians, we are invited not only to pray for refugees, but also to advocate for justice, support resettlement efforts and create communities where newcomers are treated with dignity. This World Refugee Day, may we open our hearts to those seeking safety.

*Watch over all who have been forced to flee their homes.*

*Protect families in danger, comfort those who are afraid,*

*and guide all nations to act with justice and compassion.*

*Help us to recognize Christ in every refugee and migrant,*

## Update from Fr. Frantzdy

During a May 20 conversation, Fr. Frantzdy shared an update on the situation in Duchity as well as news about his health. The key points are summarized below:

### Health Concerns

Fr. Frantzdy continues to experience persistent back pain. Because of the pain, it is difficult for him to stand up straight. He needs to travel to Port-au-Prince for a medical scan, but travel to Port au Prince is dangerous. He estimates that the scan will cost \$700 and travel could run as high as \$500-\$600.

### Security Situation

When asked about the situation in Haiti, Fr. Frantzdy said it is hard to tell if it is better or worse. There are still gang-related kidnapping cases. Even though these problems are far from Duchity, the situation affects the whole country because of the lack of safe travel to and through Port au Prince. People live with the uncertainty of not knowing what the future holds and it is very stressful.

### Education in Duchity

Final exams are being held in June. Seventeen students are graduating. If the parents can afford the cost, some of these students will go on to university. With the end of the school year, the lunch program for the students ends as there are not funds to continue it through the summer months.

### Concerns About Abuse

Fr. Frantzdy spoke at length about his desire to provide abuse-prevention training for the young women of Duchity. He would like to include the young women from Duchity and also from the surrounding 'chapel areas'. This would mean providing meals and a place to stay. This would cost approximately \$30/person. Fr. Frantzdy estimates that 150 young women would attend.

Please continue to keep Fr. Frantzdy and the people of Duchity in your prayers. Fr. Frantzdy ended the conversation by saying, "Be assured of my humble prayers. You are angels to me."

While no modern situation is identical to the evil of American slavery, people of faith are called to recognize and stand with all who experience oppression, exclusion, exploitation or injustice. As God heard the cries of the Israelites in Egypt, we are called to hear the cries of those whose dignity and freedom are threatened in our own time.

### Wholly Holy: What Have You Got to Lose or Gain?

St. Paul tells us that Jesus "emptied himself ... He humbled himself and became obedient to the point of death – even death on a cross (Philippians 2:7). In what way do we empty ourselves? Surrender? Die to self? Let go? Detach ourselves? Do I become an ascetic, a hermit, a celibate, draped in sack cloth and ashes? Jesus lived his life among his family and friends enjoying their company, dinners, wine, children, preaching, healing, banqueting and praying, just as we do, and he probably laughed a lot, too. His was not a life of denial or renunciation, but one of embracing all that is, not for his own sake, but for the purpose and will of the Father, showing us how to care for others and all of life, to "Taste and see the goodness of the Lord." (Psalm 34:8) He was so full of the love of his Father, he didn't have room for all the things that weigh us down: our patterns of thinking, doing, feeling and the allure of living according to the world's values.

Rather, Jesus was constantly attuned to his Father, "I and the Father are one," (John 10:30). Therefore, he was able purposefully to live out of compassion, gratitude, prayer, joy, wisdom, peace, courage, trust, hope, generosity, sacrifice and forgiveness, in short, Love.

*"You have made known to me the path of life; you will fill me with joy in your presence, with eternal pleasures at your right hand."* (Psalm 16:11)
