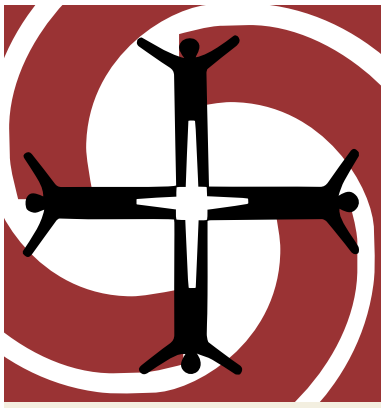

C.A.R.E CORNER

Jesus, while speaking to a large crowd, asked his audience a very reasonable question: "Why do you call me 'Lord, Lord,' but not do what I command?" (Luke 6:46) What did Jesus command? Go into the whole world and proclaim the gospel to every creature (Mark 16:15).

Make disciples by baptizing and teaching them what he taught (see Matthew 28:19-20). Pray that God's will be done on earth as in heaven (Matthew 6:10). Remain in him, as he remains in us — for without him we can do nothing (John 15:4-5). Love one another as he loves us (John 15:12).

These are challenging commands. But there are great benefits to being a disciple of Jesus Christ. If we believe that he is the Son of God, we will have life in his name (John 20:31). If we have faith in him, that faith will save us and bring us peace (Mark 5:34). If we acknowledge him before others, he will acknowledge us before his heavenly Father (Matthew 10:32). If we eat his flesh and drink his blood, we will have eternal life and be raised on the last day (John 6:54). And if we follow him, we will have more abundant life (John 10:10); his joy will be in us and our joy will be complete (John 15:11). And isn't that what we all crave?

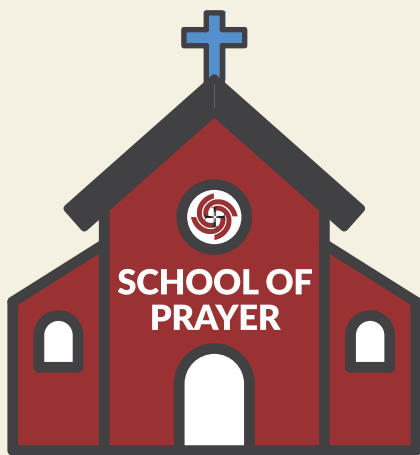


Summer Book Club

Everyone — all ages — is invited to participate.

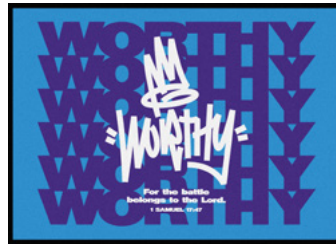

Catholic Social Teaching A Refresher

Catholic Social Teaching is one of the Church's great treasures: a way of seeing the world through the lens of the Gospel and responding with love, justice, and mercy. It reminds us that our faith is not meant to stay inside the walls of the church. The Eucharist we celebrate sends us out to care for our neighbors, protect human dignity, and work for the common good.

The U.S. bishops often summarize Catholic Social Teaching in seven themes:

- **Life and Dignity of the Human Person:** Every person is created in the image and likeness of God. Human life is sacred from conception to natural death, and every person deserves respect.
- **Call to Family, Community and Participation:** We are social beings. Families, parishes, neighborhoods and communities should help people flourish and take part in shaping society.
- **Rights and Responsibilities:** Every person has basic rights, including the right to life and to what is needed for human dignity, such as food, shelter, health care, education and work. With these rights come responsibilities to one another.
- **Option for the Poor and Vulnerable:** A community is judged by how it treats those most in need. Following Jesus means paying special attention to the poor, the lonely, the sick, the immigrant, and the marginalized.
- **The Dignity of Work and the Rights of Workers:** Work is more than a paycheck; it is a way to participate in God's creation. Workers deserve fair wages, safe conditions, and respect.
- **Solidarity:** We are one human family. Our love of neighbor crosses boundaries of race, nation, language, politics and economic status.
- **Care for God's Creation:** The earth is God's gift. Caring for creation is part of caring for one another, especially future generations and those most affected by environmental harm.

Catholic Social Teaching is not a political platform or a checklist. It is a Gospel-shaped way of life. It asks us to pray with open hearts, form our consciences, listen to those who suffer and act with courage and compassion.

As we continue to be the faith community of St. Thomas, may Catholic Social Teaching refresh our vision and renew our commitment to be the hands and feet of Christ in the world. This week, consider one simple question: Who is God inviting me to notice, serve, defend or accompany?

Styrofoam Recycling Opportunity

The City of Naperville, along with Naperville Noon Lions and Naperville Environmental and Sustainability Task Force will host a Styrofoam recycling drive-thru event from 9:00 am–12:00 pm Saturday, July 18, at Route 59 station (475 Fairway Drive). They will accept meat trays, protective packaging foam, 'to-go' containers and Styrofoam cups and plates.

Styrofoam cups and take-out containers are one of the biggest public health hazards. Styrofoam is littered more than any other waste product and fills up 30 percent of landfills globally. The worst part is that Styrofoam takes over 500 years to decompose and in the process, it leaches harmful chemicals into the environment. It is not only a dangerous air pollutant, but also poses a great threat to humans, the environment and animals.

Start setting aside your Styrofoam for the July 18 collection.

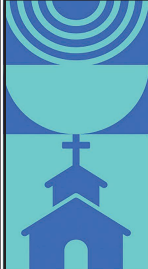
