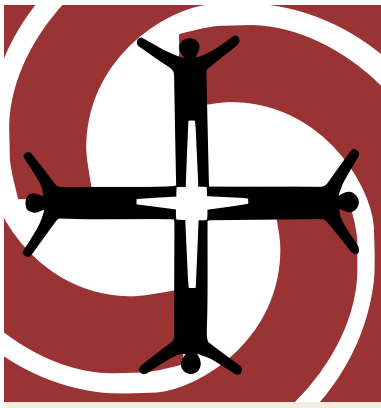

C.A.R.E CORNER

How can we even know anything about God? We can only know what God is willing to reveal. God has revealed God's own Self in the beauty, the goodness and the order of the created world. Just think for a minute about the variety and the diversity of plants, animals and sea life. It

takes quite an imagination to come up with a giraffe, an anteater, a platypus, an armadillo or a giant squid. Unique species of plants and animals exist on earth which we humans have not yet even discovered.

God has also revealed God's own Self through his actions in human history. Our Jewish ancestors in faith communicated their experiences with God, both by word of mouth and in writing. That's how we got the Bible. Our scripture stories are a source of divine revelation, put into writing for the benefit of all posterity. We owe a tremendous debt of gratitude to those who wrote, copied, compiled, preserved and distributed what they understood to be communications from the Divine — what we often call "the Word of God." That's why we call the contents of the Bible "scriptures." They are to us sacred writings.

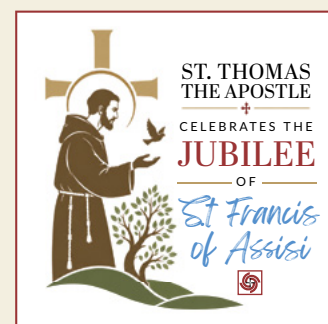

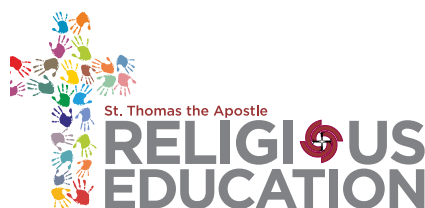

Celebrating Nicholas Black Elk, Lakota Holy Man

On Monday, August 17, St. Agnes Parish on the Pine Ridge Reservation will celebrate a special Mass commemorating the death of Nicholas Black Elk, a revered Lakota holy man, catechist and servant of God. From a young age, Black Elk received spiritual visions and became widely respected among the Lakota people for his deep prayer, wisdom and care for others. Throughout his life, he prayed with and for his community, helped heal the sick, shared the Catholic faith and worked to build understanding and unity between Native and non-Native peoples. His cause for canonization is now open, inviting the wider Church to learn from his witness of faith, humility and hope.

As a visible sign of our relationship with our twinning parish, St. Agnes, St. Thomas will also remember Nicholas Black Elk at the 8:30 am Mass Monday, August 17. Information about his life and legacy will be shared, and the Mass will include special prayers in his honor. All are welcome to attend this special liturgy and to remain afterward for refreshments and community.

Umbrellas for Peace: A Creative Celebration of Hope

On September 21, we will celebrate the International Day of Peace with a joyful, hands-on art project: creating Umbrellas for Peace. These colorful umbrellas will become a visible sign of our shared longing for peace and will be displayed as we mark the International Day of Peace and celebrate the feast day of St. Francis of Assisi on October 4.

Why Umbrellas?

Lamb Umbrellas for Peace is a global art project that invites children and adults to paint, decorate and personalize umbrellas with images and messages of peace. Instead of focusing on the daily messages of war, conflict and aggression, this project encourages people to imagine peace through color, creativity, hope and love.

The umbrella is a powerful symbol because it offers shelter and protection. It welcomes everyone beneath it — regardless of race, age, gender or nationality. The canopy becomes a space for hopes, dreams, prayers and aspirations, making each umbrella both a personal expression and a shared call for peace.

More than 900,000 people in 25 countries have taken part in Lamb Umbrellas for Peace projects, creating a worldwide collection of vibrant, one-of-a-kind works of art dedicated to peace.

Umbrellas will be available beginning the weekend of August 22–23. Children, families and adults are all invited to take one home, reflect on what peace means to them and decorate it in their own unique way. The result will be a fun, meaningful and colorful expression of peace that we can share as a community. More information will be available in the coming weeks.

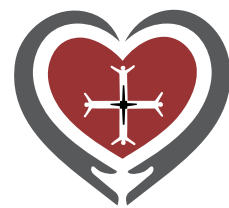
Pastoral Care News Staff Changes in Pastoral Care
