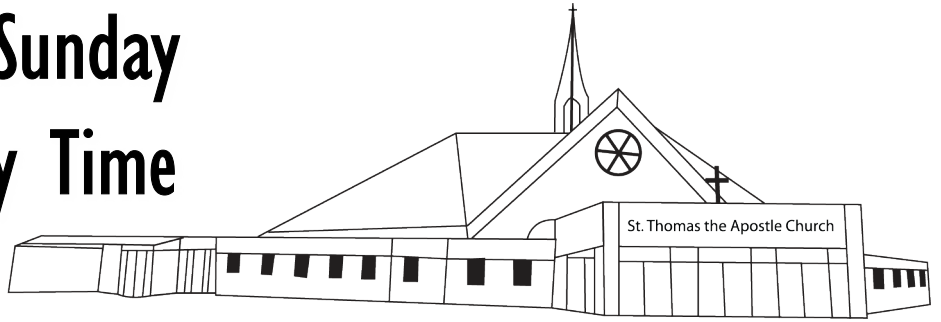

## Nicene Creed




