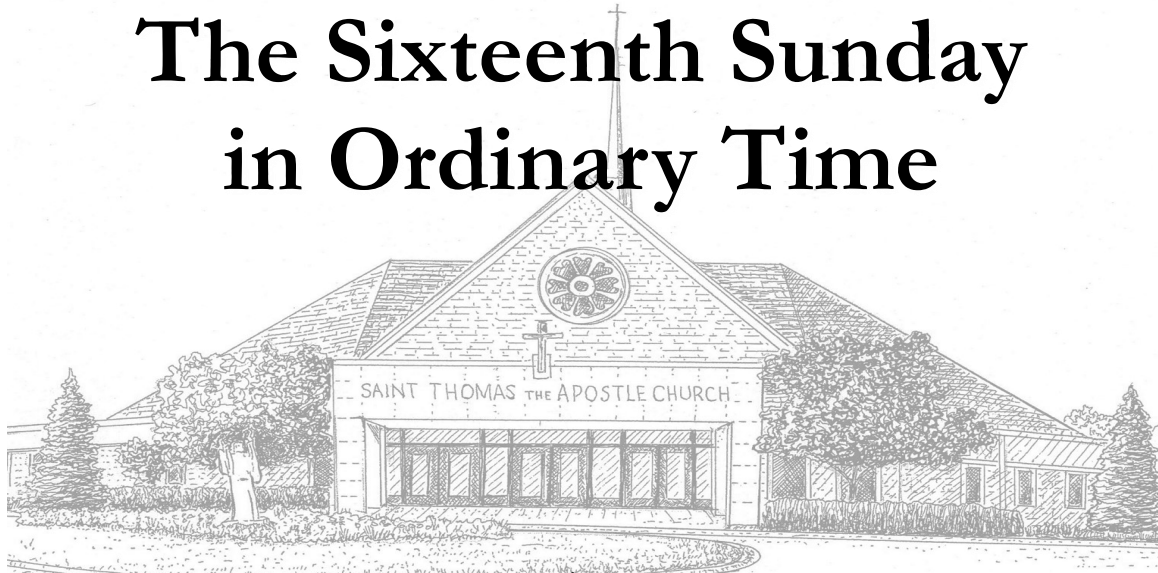

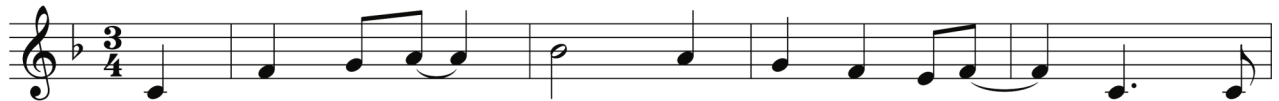

Profession of Faith
