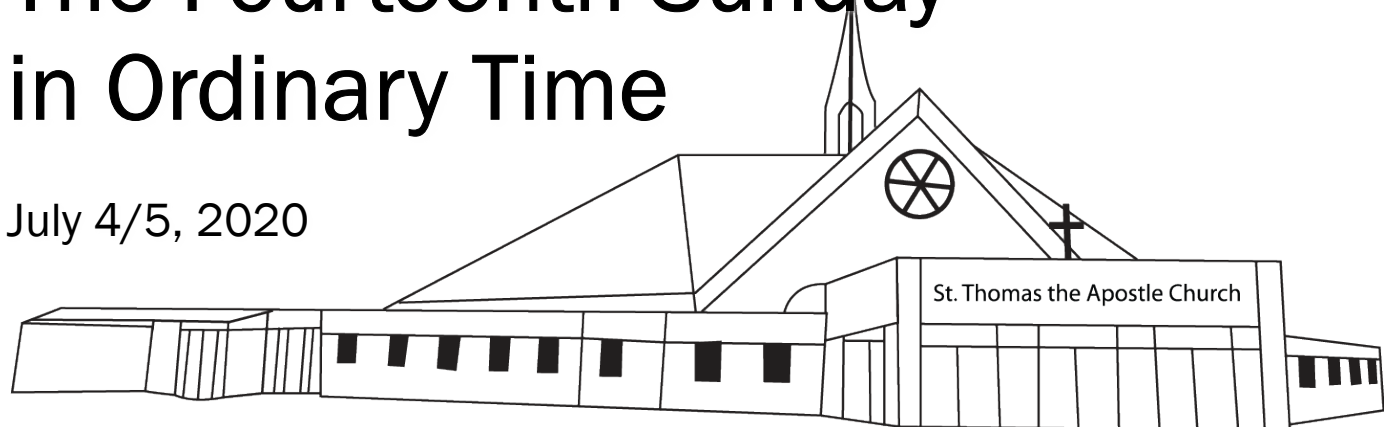

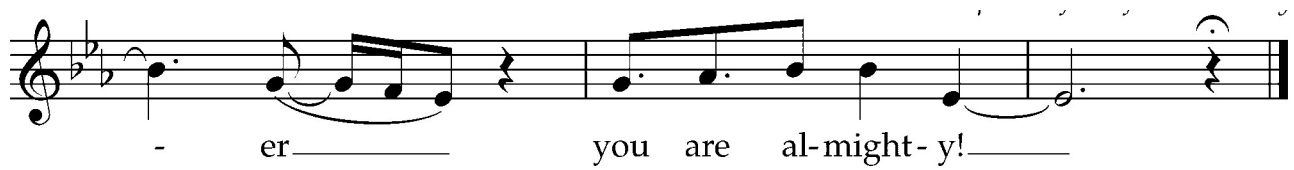

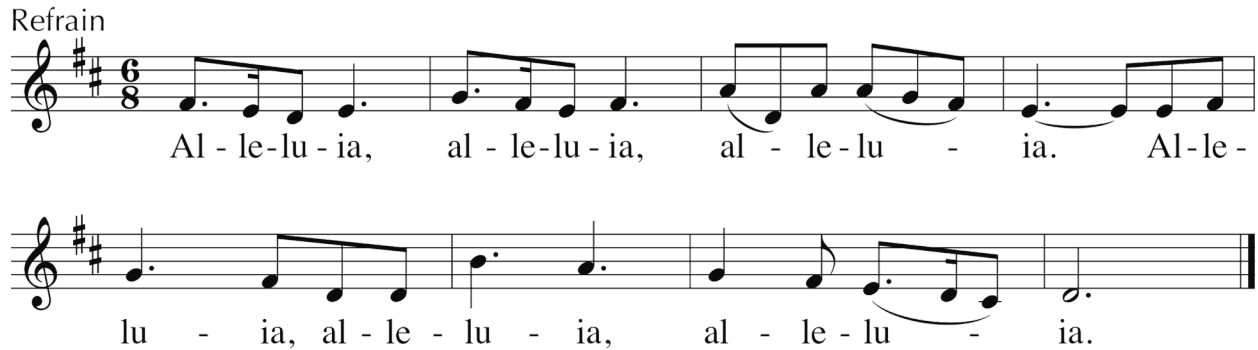

Homily

Profession of Faith






