Nicene Creed





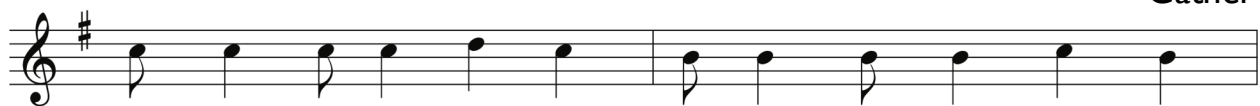
