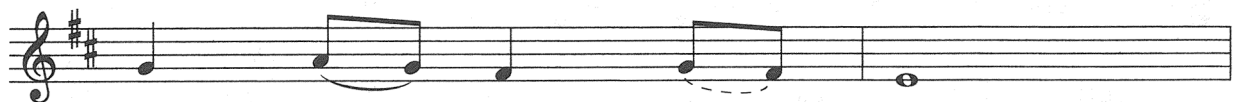

#### Profession of Faith



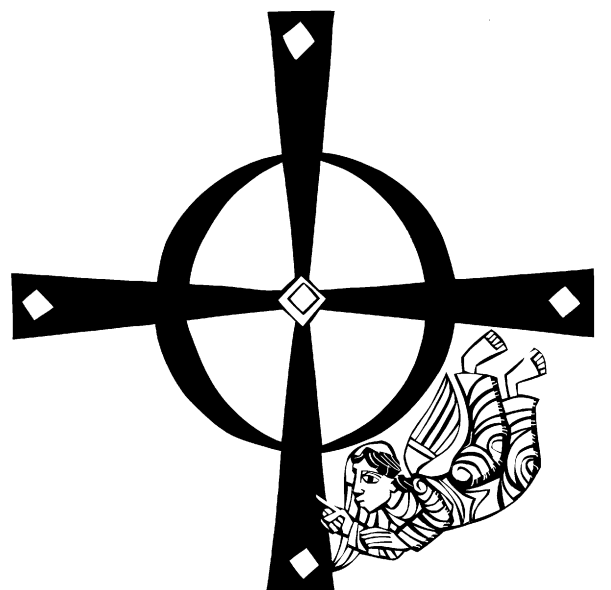
