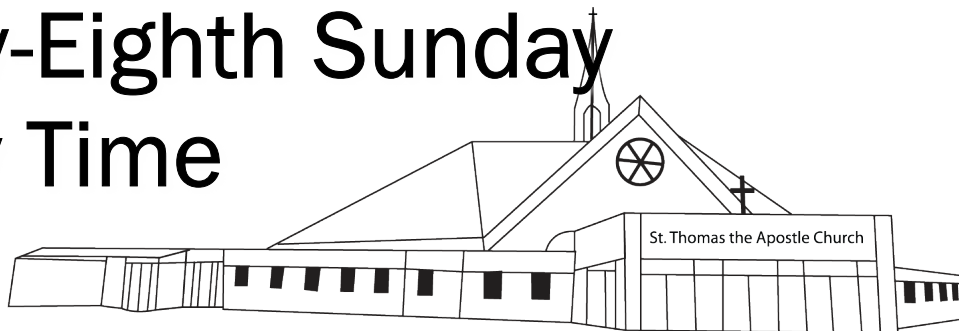

Profession of Faith




