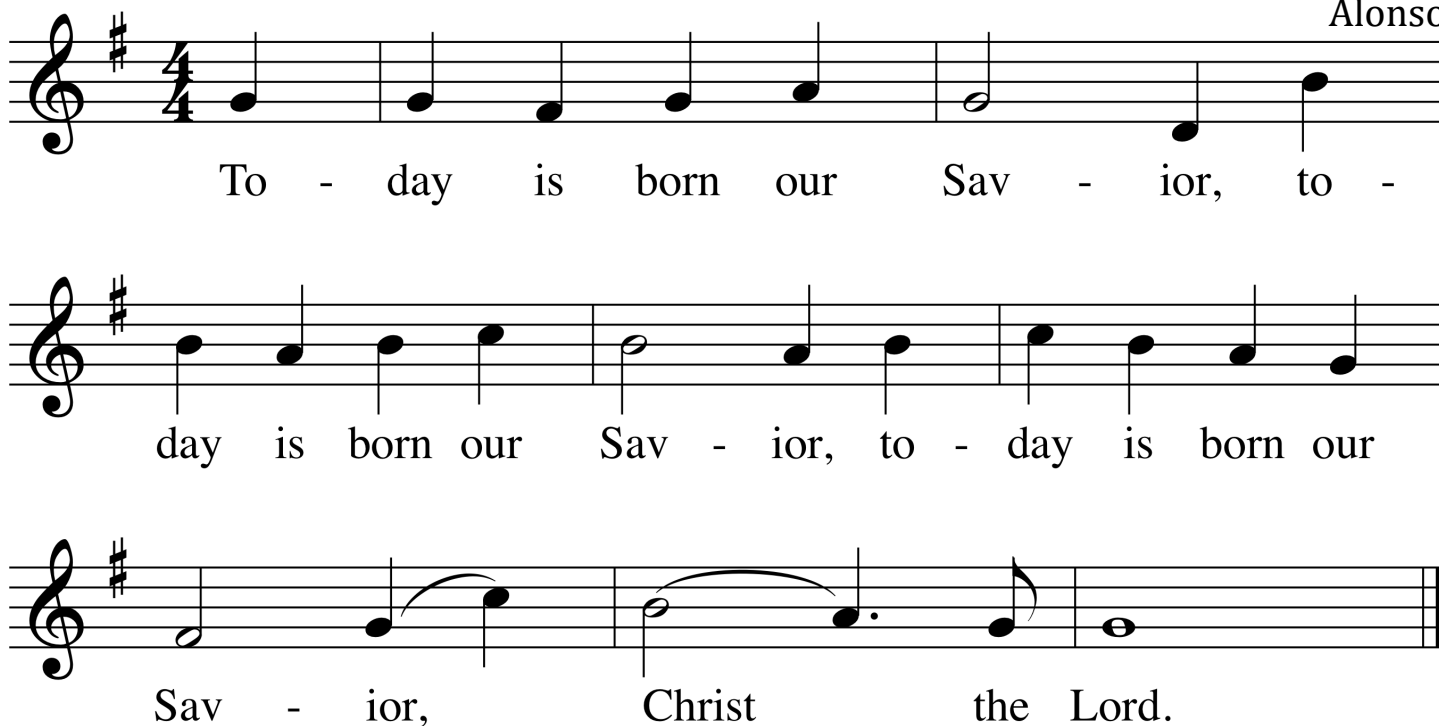

Nicene Creed

I believe in one God, the Father Almighty,
