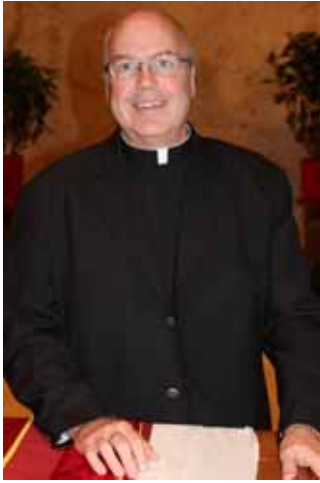

From the Pastor's Desk...

As we celebrate both the Ascension of the Lord and Mother's Day this weekend, I can't help but think of a similarity between Jesus taking "leave" of his disciples and mothers eventually having to take "leave" of their children. In both cases, that "leaving" is necessary so that the disciples may go out on their own to spread the Good News, and we "leave" mom to go out on our own to

become who we are meant to become. That "leaving" is never easy, but as Jesus promised to be with His disciples and us until the end of the world, hopefully we have experienced the love and support of our mothers as we make our journey in life. And for those of us whose moms have died, I hope you still experience their loving presence in a new way.

I was lucky to have three moms in my life! My mother Dorothy, a nurse by profession, died of rheumatic heart fever the day after Christmas when I was 5 years old. While I have only vague memories of my mom, I am certain that her spirit of helping others influenced my vocation to the priesthood. My father re-married almost a year later, and my step-mother Evelyn, who I never referred to as "step" mother, had a zest for life and trying anything once! She certainly influenced me to risk stepping outside my comfort zone! And she was a practical joker which I think I get a bit of mischievousness from! She died while I was in seminary. My dad was one of those guys who just couldn't live without a woman in his life and married again at age 77! I officiated the wedding! It was a comfort to have Sylvia as a companion to my father as he aged and developed Alzheimer's, and I lived 200 miles away. My father and three mothers are all now enjoying eternal life, but each year on Mother's Day, I thank God for the gift of three very wonderful women in my life!

I am out of town this Mother's Day weekend attending the college graduation of my great nephew from the University of the Incarnate Word in San Antonio, Texas. And so I extend to all our mothers at St. Thomas my wishes for a very happy and blessed Mother's Day. May you feel the love and appreciation of your family. To all expectant mothers, I offer a prayer for safe delivery and a healthy child. I also wish to acknowledge today those women who have been role models and mother figures in our lives – the women who by vocational choice or those who have carried the sorrow of being unable to have children – you are appreciated as well!

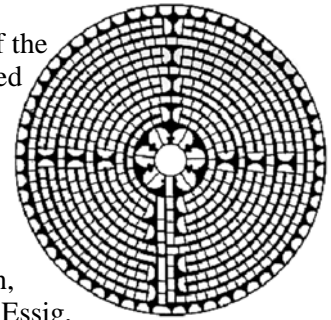
In ancient Israel, it was common for a king to have a right-hand man, a chief steward, a prime minister of sorts. Everyone would have known who that person was. He would have been clothed in a robe, girded in a sash and conferred with the authority of the king (Isaiah 22:21) This minister would also receive the key of the House of David, the key being a symbol of authority. It was to Peter that Jesus conferred the "keys to the kingdom of heaven." (Matthew 16:19) The rest of the disciples would have understood what that meant. Why did Jesus choose Peter? Jesus had asked His disciples "who do you say that I am?" (Matthew 16:15)

It was Peter who spoke up and declared Jesus to be the Christ, the Son of the living God. Jesus replied that it was His heavenly Father who had revealed that to Peter. So Jesus in turn declared Peter to be the rock on which He would build His church. And we will soon discover that Peter indeed stepped up and became a visible leader and foundational player in the early Christian church.

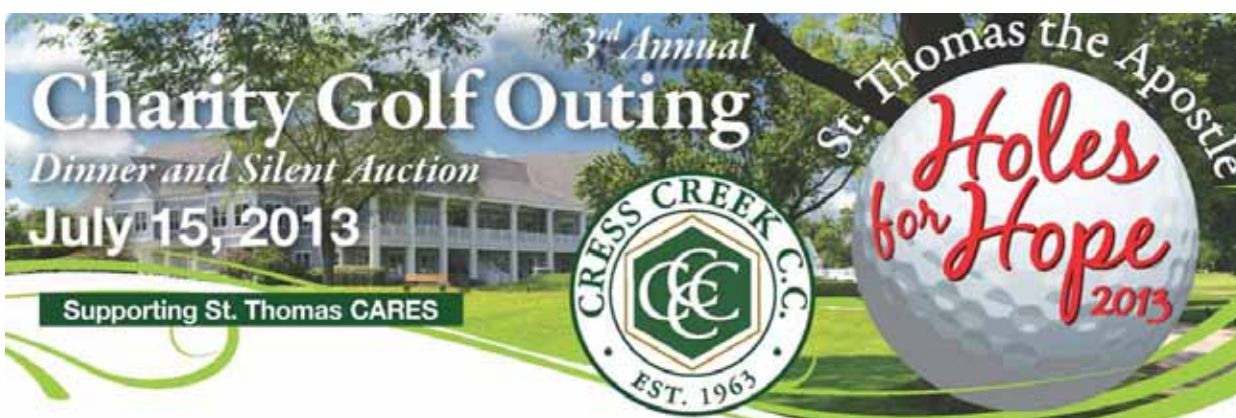
Among those helped during the last week of April were:

- ... A house painter who has not been finding full time work, was hospitalized for stomach issues. When he was released he couldn't afford the cost of his prescriptions. St. Thomas CARES paid the \$102 for his prescriptions.

- ... A homeless man living at PADS sites came to St. Thomas in need of a gas card to allow him to get to Labor Ready where he would have the opportunity to be selected for day labor jobs. St. Thomas CARES provided a \$25 gas card.

- ... A local area man was in danger of being evicted. He had lost his last job and is on limited unemployment. He has two part-time jobs starting in early May which should allow him to move forward. He had paid \$485 of his rent. St. Thomas CARES paid the remaining \$400.

In April, St. Thomas Cares distributed \$5,490 to 42 client cases.

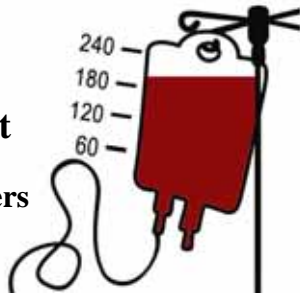

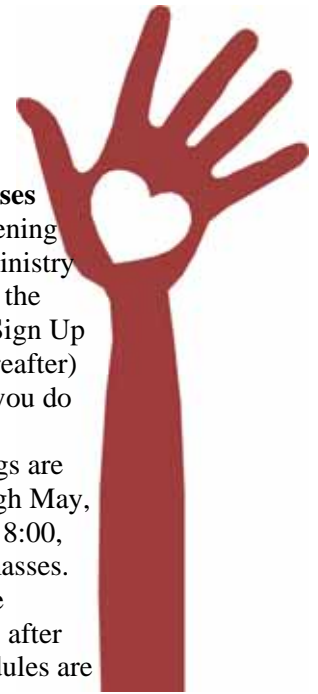
