Dear Parish Family.

Many of us remember the first time we tried to ride a bike without training wheels. We fell. We got up, many times with a parent's help, kept trying, and maybe kept falling until we finally got on and kept on going. But if we had we not even tried to ride the bike after falling the first time, we would've never been able to ride.

All four gospels describe the time when the disciples saw Jesus walk on water. Only Matthew writes that, at Jesus' invitation, Peter also walks on water but only for a short time. That he did it at all is an amazing feat itself!

But Peter fell in the water. Jesus came and picked him up. Peter fell again when he denied being Jesus' follower three different times. Jesus picked him up again by forgiving him.

Life is a series of falls, whether it be in relationships with others, tough economic times, sickness or death of a loved one. Our Lord stretches out His hand to pick us up, as He did with Peter. All He asks from us is what He asked from Peter, to have faith.

Saturday, August 15, is the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Usually it is a holy day of obligation but, because it falls on a Saturday, it is not a holy day of obligation this year. Since we are unable to have morning Masses on Saturdays because we do not have enough volunteers to help with the check-in process for Masses, we will not have Mass for the Assumption that Saturday morning. The Saturday evening Mass will be for the 19th Sunday of Ordinary Time.

Reflection on the Readings

The readings today all deal with faith in God's power and Presence on our behalf. Elijah discerns God's Presence in the most insignificant phenomenon. In the Gospel, Peter experiences Jesus pull him up from waves of sure death. No matter how crushed our spirit is, no matter how hard it is to discern the Presence of God, no matter how grave the danger we are in, or how weak our faith is, God is always present and acting to save us.



Exciting New Ministry Opportunities!

With COVID-19 we have had to re-imagine and revamp many things we do with Liturgy as our primary way of reaching parishioners is now via the internet. We began recording Masses beginning Sunday, March 22, and now are livestreaming our two weekend Masses for people to be able to watch from home live or watch at their convenience. Thanks to a generous donation, last weekend we began using a new professional camera that allows us to zoom, pan and show the congregation to provide an even better sense of connection for those watching at home. With this new technology comes the need for additional help. There are two new ministry options that are outlined below. Both of these ministries would also be great for teens who know and enjoy technology.

Camera Operator (Videographer)

The main responsibility of this ministry is to operate the camera during Mass. You will zoom in and out, pan the camera to the correct area of focus during the Mass. If you have ever used a camcorder, you will have no trouble doing this, as it is basically all the same. There will be a minor secondary responsibility of starting and ending the livestream on the computer.

Multimedia Coordinator

The main responsibility of this ministry is to handle the slides we project on the screen before and during Mass. They will close out the pre-Mass slide show and queue up the slides we use during Mass. And then manually advance the slides used during Mass in-sync with the congregation using a wireless remote. On some occasions it may also mean playing a video. Basic PowerPoint knowledge is helpful, but not required.

Faith and Formation Commission — Adult

C.A.R.E. CORNER

As we saw last week, it took our Church centuries to work out it's theology about Jesus. In the meantime, some false **claims arose** and serious **dissensions** ensued. We mentioned the Gnostics last week. Such teachings were diverting believers from the one, true gospel perpetuated by the historical Church. The faith was being **eroded** and the ruptures were **wounding** the Body of Christ and **separating** people from full communion with the apostolic Church established by Christ. We refer to such claims as heresies. And there were a lot of them.

For example, the Docetists claimed Jesus was God, but not human — he only appeared to be human. That denied the humanity of Christ in spite of the fact that the apostles had lived and traveled with a very human Jesus and had witnessed to Jesus' physical suffering. The Arians on the other hand denied that Jesus was God. When the Nestorians came on the scene, they believed Jesus had been two different persons rather than one person with both a human and a divine nature. Later, the Monophysites taught that after Jesus was born, his human nature was absorbed into his divine nature, so he really only had one nature, which was divine. Heresies attempt to make the faith more acceptable to human reason rather than rely on God's truth. A variety of claims about Jesus Christ continue to **challenge** our Church today.



From the Behavioral Health Ministry **Teletherapy**



In Chicago and across the country, the pandemic and the accompanying social isolation have spiked symptoms of mental health illness for some. Nearly half of American adults reported that their mental health has been negatively impacted due to worry and stress over the virus, according to a recent Kaiser Family Foundation poll.

Gabe Howard, a mental health advocate, said that while he's glad there's an increased discussion about mental health issues, he feels that people

suffering from severe mental illness are being left out of the conversation. "A lot of the focus is on how are we going to survive mentally through this process ... not on how do we help people with schizophrenia through this process?"

For some struggling with mental health issues, teletherapy has been an option. Micah loffe, a psychologist in Chicago, says, "That's been a wonderful way of working with clients who get stuck in their home setting, whether that's repeated hand washing or avoiding certain activities, we can be there with them."

The disciples said to Jesus, "This is a deserted place ... dismiss the crowds so that they can go and buy food for themselves." I would guess that many in the crowd did not have the means to buy food for themselves. Jesus replied to his disciples, "give them some food yourselves." And behold the small amount of food they gave was blessed by Jesus and fed the multitudes.

As disciples of Jesus, we are called to reach out to others and give what is needed, and what we give is blessed, and the good it does is magnified far beyond the original value. The summer mission appeal is an opportunity to give what is needed.

Ertha Papillon is a leader in our Twinning community in the mountains of southwest Haiti. She was schooled by Catholic Sisters, who taught her to teach and to serve our God in all ways. Ertha was further educated and became a nurse in Port-au-Prince where she worked with Mother Teresa. She was moved by Mother Teresa's self-less acts of love and her inner joy of serving God. Ertha returned to her parish, Ste. Marie-Madeleine. She founded a school and an orphanage to serve the impoverished, malnourished, and orphaned children in her Trois-Bois community.

In the video, Ertha outlined the help that is most needed at this time. The school children often injure themselves on the rocky school grounds. Ertha would like to finish the cement paving.

The Orphanage has many needs:

- Ongoing funds for food and salaries for the caretakers are always needed.
- Finishing the second building will provide dorm space for the boys and a cafeteria. Currently all are crowded into one building.
- A security fence is needed around the orphanage.
- A graduate of the orphanage and St. Thomas High School is being partially sponsored to study agronomy. Ertha is looking for others to help sponsor her education.

In today's gospel, the small amount of food the disciples gave was blessed by Jesus and fed the multitudes. As we, also disciples of Jesus, provide Ertha and her children with what is needed, it will be blessed, and the effects will be magnified far beyond the original value.

John Levis, who died July 17, was the U.S. representative for Georgia's 5th Congressional District. The civil rights leader wrote an essay shortly before his death, intending that it be published in The New York Times on the day of his funeral. Portions are included below. "While my time here has now come to an end, I want you to know that in the last days and hours of my life you inspired me. Around the country and the world you set aside race, class, age, language and nationality to demand respect for human dignity.

Emmett Till was my George Floyd. He was 14 when he was killed, and I was only 15 years old at the time. I will never ever forget the moment when it became so clear that he could easily have been me.

Ordinary people with extraordinary vision can redeem the soul of America by getting in what I call good trouble, necessary trouble. Voting and participating in the democratic process are key. The vote is the most powerful nonviolent change agent you have in a democratic society. You must use it because it is not guaranteed. You can lose it.

Though I may not be here with you, I urge you to answer the highest calling of your heart and stand up for what you truly believe. So I say to you, walk with the wind, brothers and sisters, and let the spirit of peace and the power of everlasting love be your guide."


Continue to Fill Your Little Brown Box
