An elderly man whose health is quickly deteriorating; an unborn baby girl whose diagnosis indicates she may not live very long; a little boy with Down syndrome; a mother facing terminal cancer — each may have great difficulties and need assistance, but each of their lives is a good and perfect gift.

Experiencing suffering — or watching another suffer — is one of the hardest human experiences. But we are not alone. Christ experienced suffering more deeply than we can comprehend, and our own suffering can be meaningful when we unite it with His.

Jesus is with us every step of the way, giving us the grace we need. God invites us to embrace the lives we have been given, for as long as they are given. Every life is worth living."

Twenty-Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time: Reflecting on God's Word

The basis of Jewish law says that all human beings are created equal in the image of God. The disciples attempt to keep some children and their parents from disturbing Jesus, probably thinking that women and children were not important enough to disturb the Master! Jesus is indignant. Gathering the children, he says self-important people should imitate them. A loving Father offers us the gift of faith. Jesus is asking us to be child-like accepting this gift with simplicity and trust. Since we do not earn faith — it is freely given to us — we are called to express this faith in how we live our lives. We are equal in God's sight and equally responsible to live up to our calling.

Living Stewardship Now

We have an equal responsibility to serve, yet in the average parish 20 percent of the parishioners do 80 percent of the work and the giving. What can you do, beginning today, to change that percentage.

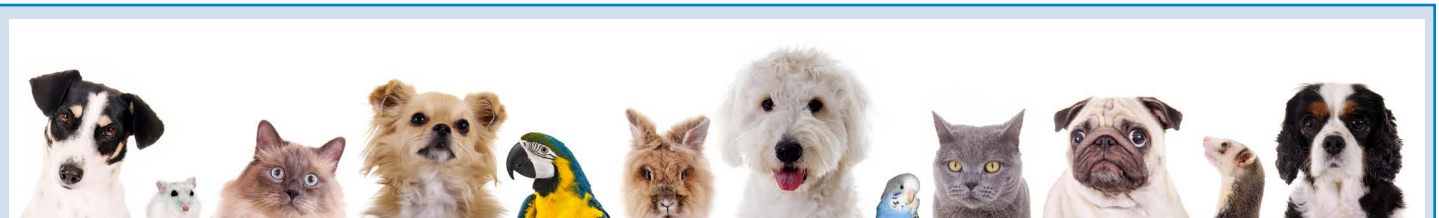

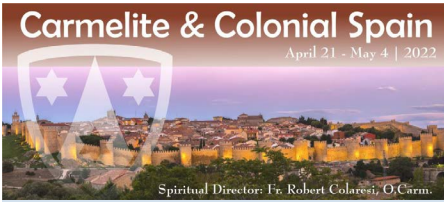
All Saints

Monday, November 1 is the Solemnity of All Saints — A Holy Day of Obligation and also one of Opportunity. We will have Masses at 8:30 am and at 7:00 pm in the Church. On this day the Church honors all the saints of heaven, God's holy ones — known and unknown to us. We celebrate all the holy men and women who, throughout the ages, exemplified the faith; whose lives, in some way or another, mirrored the Paschal Mystery of Christ in profound ways. This solemnity honors all the saints; in particular those who are not individually recognized throughout the year. This day, coupled with the November 2 Commemoration of All the Faithful departed (All Souls), stands at the beginning of the month of November — a month in which we remember and pray for the dead.

Pilgrimage to Carmelite and Colonial Spain April 21–May 4, 2022

Following in the footsteps and spirituality of Saints Teresa of Avila and John of the Cross, the great Carmelite Doctors of mysticism and spirituality, we will visit Avila, Alba de Tormes, Salamanca, Fontiveros and Segovia.

We also include history and heritage of Spain, including the Islamic and colonial elements. Thus we visit Granada, Cordoba and Seville, along with Madrid and Toledo. Spain is a wonderful country, rich in history and heritage. Parallel schools of mysticism and spirituality mutually enriched each other. Reactionary Catholicism manifested in the Inquisition, eventually destroyed this time of enlightened peace when the Jews and Moslems were expelled from Catholic Spain in 1492.

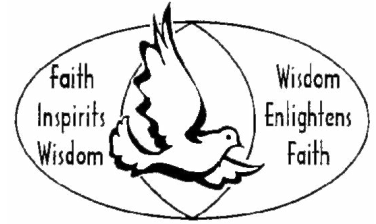

C.A.R.E. CORNER

Many people find that their church community functions as an extended family. They attend meetings, programs and worship services in order to connect in fellowship with other members of their faith community. Such fellowship can spawn life-giving friendships. After all, even Jesus did not go it alone. After he called disciples to journey with him, he ultimately came to consider them to be his “friends.” (see John 15:15) And friends act out of love for one another, which perpetuates the Gospel message.

Within our Catholic theology, we see family built right into the concept of “Church.” The Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) # 759 calls the Church the “family of God.” We address God as our Father. We acknowledge Jesus’ Mother Mary as our own spiritual Mother. Jesus called himself the bridegroom and we see the Church as the Bride of Christ (CCC #796). We also see Jesus as our brother, and that makes all other members of our Church our spiritual siblings. Church functions as a place of connection and visible union, just like you would expect and hope to find within family life. It’s our place of relationship of unity, our place of communion, modeled for us in the Trinity. And its typically more enjoyable to be with our family in person, rather than to have little contact or to be separated by distance.

News from All Saints Catholic Academy

'New' this Year at All Saints

Last school year was *a year like no other at All Saints*. The primary goal in 2020-2021 was to **bring our students back to full day, 5 day in person instruction**, and to **keep them safely in school** for the entirety of the school year.

Toward this end, All Saints was **100 percent successful** in completing the 176 day school year **without remote instruction** (side note — some local public elementary schools were remote for an entire year — from March 2020 until March 2021), and **ASCA never had to close** because of COVID. Our students prospered because of the opportunity to be in school with their teachers and friends; however, so many other activities had to be canceled or postponed.

How does the current 2021-2022 school year stack up?

Safety is still #1; however the events and activities that **connect us with each other and bring the fun to school ARE BACK!**

Students are enjoying after school extracurricular activities again — **Band, Math Club, Sticky Fingers Cooking Class, Lego Robotics Club, Art Enrichment Club and Chess Scholars.**

Student athletes are playing and competing again in our fall sports — **volleyball and cross country**; and fans are in the stands and on the course cheering them on.

School wide events have returned. More than 500 parents and students attended our back to school **Meet and Greet** event held outdoors on our ASCA campus. **Trunk or Treat**, a popular Halloween tradition will be celebrated at the end of October. School parents are looking forward to **Parents Night Out** at Topgolf in November.

During the school day, **student enrichment programs** are up and running. **Parent volunteers** are active in the lunchroom and at recess. Parents and visitors will be joining us for our **weekly school masses**.

We welcomed close to 250 grandparents and VIP's to campus for **Grandparents Day** in September.

Community outreach and engagement activities that are the hallmarks of the servant leadership that we practice at All Saints have been scheduled. In August, we collected over 300 boxes of cereal for Loaves and Fishes.

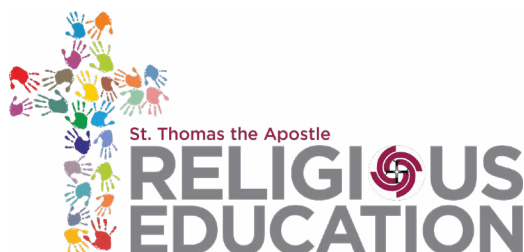

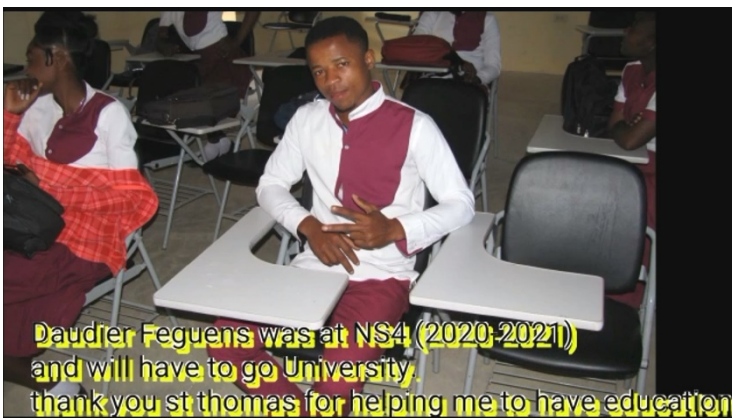

Service Commission — Pastoral Care

From the Behavioral Health Ministry Suicide Prevention

Suicide is often related to an untreated mental health issue. Thoughts of suicide can affect anyone regardless of socioeconomic status, race, age or gender. In Chicago, public health officials issued a health alert in November 2020, regarding increased concern about a rise in suicides among older people of all races and, in particular, African American adults in their 20s.

Facts

- Suicide is the second leading cause of death among people aged 10-34
- Suicide is the 10th cause of death overall
- More women than men attempt suicide but 78% of all people who die by suicide are male
- The overall suicide rate in the U.S. has increased by 35% since 1999

Warning signs

- Comments or thoughts about suicide
- Increased alcohol and/or drug use
- Withdrawal from family and friends
- Intense mood swings
- Impulsive or reckless behavior

Behavior requiring immediate action

- Collecting/saving pills
- Buying a weapon
- Giving away possessions
- Saying goodbye to family and friends

How to handle a suicide crisis:

- Talk openly and ask direct questions such as, “Do you have a plan for how you would kill yourself?”
- Remove means including weapons and pills
- Stay calm and ask questions such as “Can I help you call your therapist/psychiatrist?”
- Please reach out for support at the locations below or talk to your family physician if not in an emergency situation.
- If someone is in immediate risk of harm, take them to the closest hospital, call 911 or the National Prevention Lifeline at 800.273.TALK (8255).

Soraya will be covering all aspects of fire and life safety and will also include information on emergency preparedness. The presentation will cover everything from the address on your home, to smoke alarms and holiday decorations, etc.

What should you have prepared should you need to call 9-1-1? We'll cover that too! This presentation is to disseminate important fire and life safety information to the PrimeTime group in order to encourage citizen action regarding safety strategies. Did you know that falls, in and around the home, are top causes of injuries to older adults? Older adults are also at a greater risk than others of perishing in a house fire. Many of these and other injuries result from hazards that are easy to overlook — but also easy to fix! By spotting these hazards and taking simple steps to correct them, you can prevent injuries to yourself or visitors to your home.

From the Office of the Parish Nurse Memory Maximizers

Here's the latest research to help you keep your brain sharp.

Breathing Exercise May Lower Blood Pressure, Sharpen Memory

A special breathing workout, originally designed to help strengthen the diaphragm and other breathing muscles of critically ill respiratory disease patients, may also benefit the heart and brain.

The exercise, called High-Resistance Inspiratory Muscle Strength Training (IMST), involves the inhaling through special handheld device that provides resistance. Picture sucking through a straw that sucks back. In a study published recently in the *Journal of the American Heart Association*, researchers found that a daily five-minute IMST breathing workout (about 30 inhalations) was associated with a nine-point reduction in systolic (top number) blood pressure and a 45 percent improvement in the ability of arteries to expand when needed. The workouts also led to an increase in the levels of nitric oxide, a molecule that plays a key role in the artery dilation and the prevention of plaque buildup within arteries. Earlier IMST studies also showed that the brief workouts may improve symptoms of obstructive sleep apnea. Individuals using the devices also showed improvements on test of memory and cognition. Lowering blood pressure and improving circulation are two important steps in bolstering brain function.

If you are interested in IMST, talk with your doctor. IMST shouldn't take the place of regular exercise, but it may be a convenient and effective way to complement your usual exercise routine.

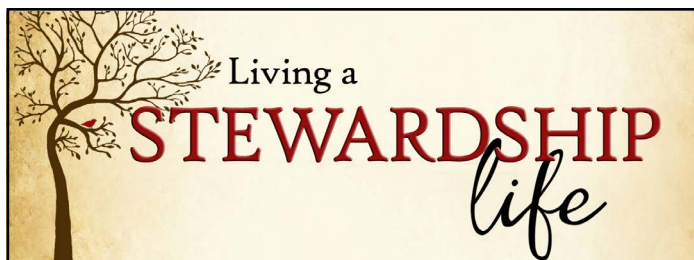
