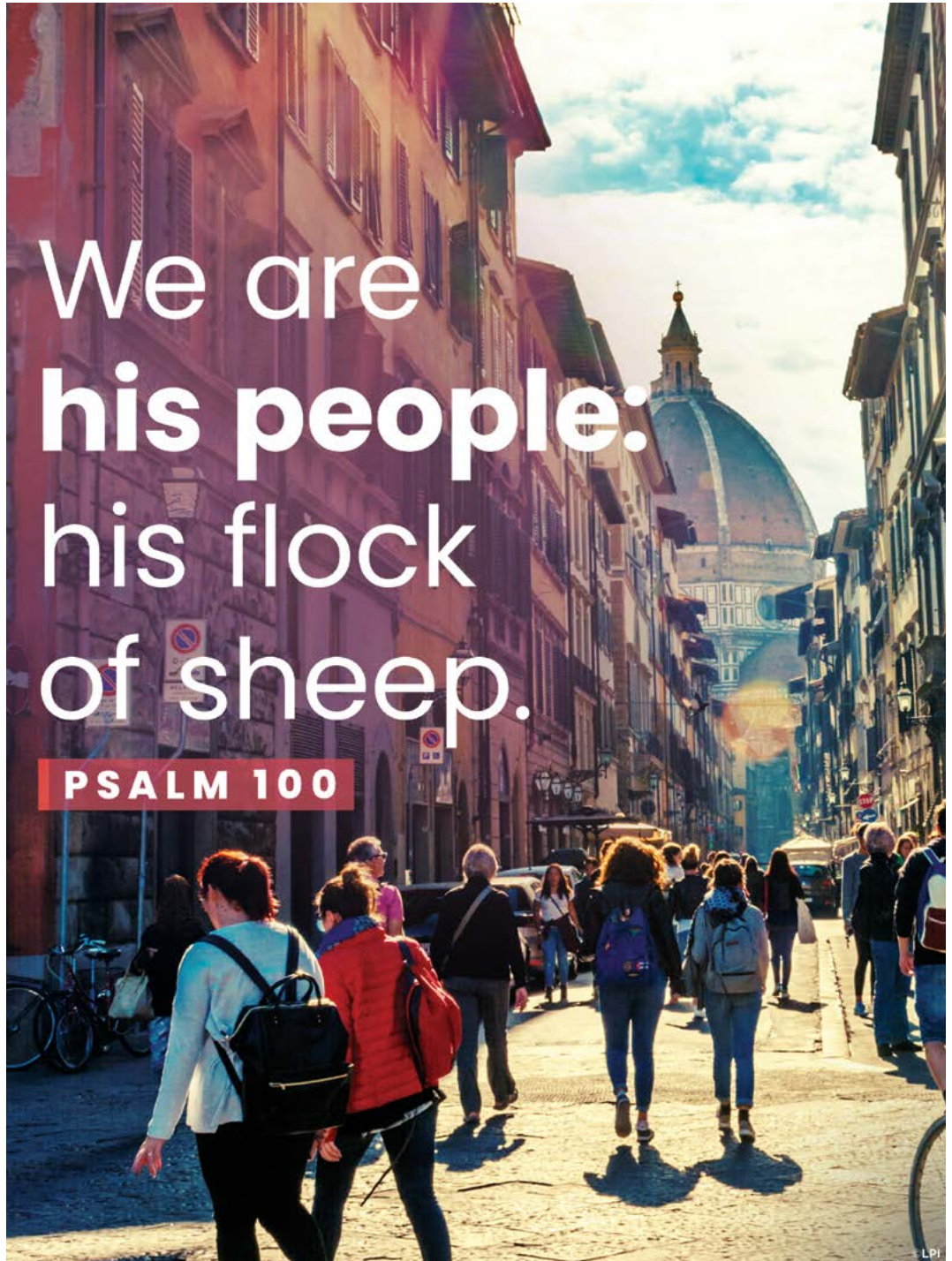

Bucket List Questions

The Bucket List is a movie about two men, played by Jack Nicholson and Morgan Freeman, who find themselves sharing a hospital room, each diagnosed with terminal cancer. As they talk about the days that remain for each of them, they begin to discuss what they would yet hope to experience before they die. Hence, the title of the film.

At one point amid their many escapades together, Freeman suggests that God is going to ask two questions when they stand before the pearly gates. Nicholson hears this and grows edgy, suspecting his eternal future may be at risk. Freeman then tells him that the first question will be, "Have you ever experienced joy in life?" At that, Nicholson beams with a silly grin that suggests he is thinking more of pleasure than he is of joy. Nonetheless, he decides his lock on eternal bliss is halfway there. Then Freeman reveals the second question: "Have you ever brought joy to the lives of others?" With that, Nicholson's face drops, realizing his life has been more about himself than about others.

Religion is not just about "going to church" but also about "going from church into the world." That, in a sense, is what Jesus did when he named the twelve apostles and sent them out to heal, bring life, and overcome evil. It is also what we find ourselves sent to do amid the scattered events of every week — to bring joy into the lives of others.

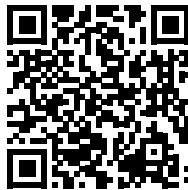
Homily Series

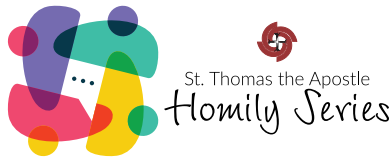

C.A.R.E CORNER

Jews and Christians no longer sacrifice animals as acts of worship. But the concept of sacrifice remains. There are other things of value to us that we can present as an offering to God. For example, Joseph, while serving as a house slave, was willing to endure a jail sentence rather than give in to the sinful requests of his master's wife (Genesis 39). Moses led a song of praise to God for delivering the people from the Egyptian army at the Red Sea (Exodus 15). The prophet Isaiah made it clear to Israel that God was interested in their hearts rather than their lip service (Isaiah 29:13).



Psalms 51, attributed to King David, is a prayer of repentance in which David spoke of his sacrifice of a contrite and humbled heart after his indiscretion with another man's wife (verse 19). The prophet Hosea told Israel that God preferred they show mercy and acquire knowledge of God rather than offer animal sacrifices and burnt offerings (Hosea 6:6). St. Paul urged Christians to offer their bodies as living sacrifices as their spiritual worship (Romans 12:1). In other words, in your thoughts and in your actions, do what is holy and pleasing to God, which often means sacrificing what you think you really want. Your act of sacrifice might include just showing up and gathering together with others for communal worship.

Yes, that's exactly what author Haley Stewart offers in Jane Austen's *Genius Guide to Life: On Love, Friendship and Becoming the Person God Created You to Be*. 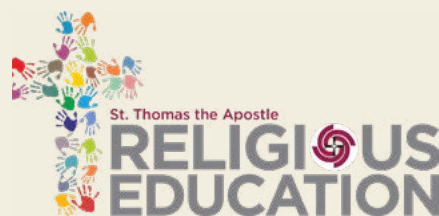

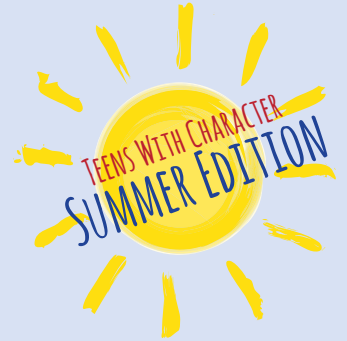

We are asking parishioners to donate the food items needed each month. Thanks to all those who helped with donations in June. We are now asking for donations for Thursday, July 6.

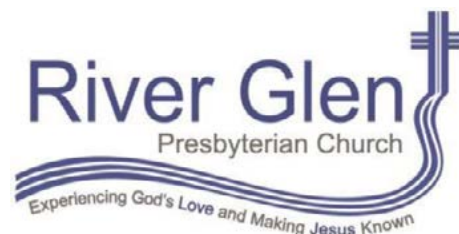
How to donate food for Hesed House
