

We can continue to grow in Perseverance and Humility by doing our homework:

- Reflect upon a time when you had to endure a situation that required either sacrifice or hardship (or both) but it led to a greater good in time, blessing others.
- Share your story of perseverance with another to encourage them.
- Avoid comparisons. When you catch yourself measuring your worth against someone else, stop and thank God for both of you.
- Listen more than you speak. Let the goal be to understand, not win.
- Serve quietly. Do one act of kindness no one knows about except you and God.
- Pray the tax collector's prayer: "O God, be merciful to me, a sinner."

Homily Series is a quarterly outreach to the parish and beyond, wherein we:

- explicitly extend invitations for others to join us at St. Thomas:
- grow in discipleship as a parish, by focusing on one topic together;
- foster community engagement with receptions following the services.

Acts 10 tells us Cornelius was a centurion and therefore a Gentile. But he is also described as a God-fearer and someone who was generous with the Jewish people and prayed to their God. So his actions certainly stood as witness to Divine Presence. Cornelius

invited Peter into his home and in preparation for that visit, invited many of his own relatives and friends to meet Peter as well. As a Jew, Peter knew it was against the Mosaic law for him to enter the household of a Gentile. They would not have been able to eat together due to the dietary rules of the Jews.



But Peter did indeed visit Cornelius in his home and came to believe that "God shows no partiality" to Jews over Gentiles or anyone else (vs. 34). Following Peter's proclamation of the life of Jesus to the Gentile audience, the Holy Spirit came upon all who were listening. They then were baptized "in the name of Jesus Christ" (10:48). Ultimately Peter had to explain what he had done to his fellow apostles and disciples. They affirmed his actions and glorified God (Acts 11:18) for granting "life-giving repentance to the Gentiles too." We are called to remember that no one is outside the reach of the Risen Christ.

St Thomas Land Acknowledgement

During the month of November, a Land Acknowledgement will be read as we begin our weekend and Thanksgiving Day liturgies. A Land Acknowledgement is a formal statement that recognizes and respects Indigenous Peoples as the traditional stewards of the land.

From a faith perspective, the Land Acknowledgement is read before liturgies to recognize that long before we dedicated St. Thomas as a place of prayer, there were First Nations for whom this very land was sacred. We, also, are called to continue good stewardship of the land that was originated by indigenous peoples.

Land Acknowledgement Statement


As we gather for worship this day in this sacred space, we acknowledge that the land on which we gather is the ancestral homeland of the Council of Three Fires: the Ojibwe, Odawa and Potawatomi Nations. More than a dozen other Nations called this region of Northeastern Illinois home. Until their forced removal, this land was their home, the source of their food, their gathering space, their place of healing, and their sacred space. We recognize the enduring presence of Indigenous peoples connected to and on this land. We commit to continually learning how to be better stewards of the land we inhabit and the people we encounter.

The seven-year-old daughter is thriving academically, socially, emotionally and physically. She's very conscientious and works hard in school. On a recent assessment test, she scored at or above grade level in all areas. Our family is very grateful for the financial support they have received from St. Thomas.

educator and facilitates the grief support groups at St. Thomas. She is the author of the book Grieving: A Spiritual Process for Catholics, which will be available for purchase.






